Why conserve water?

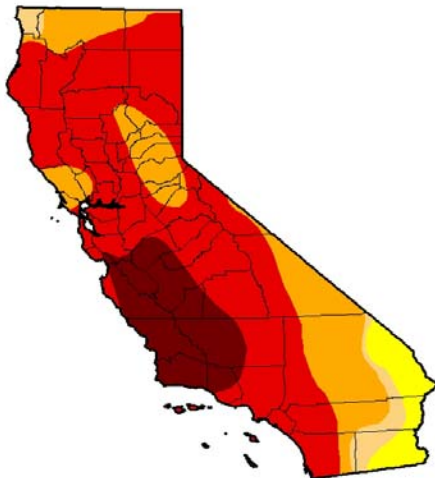
- Save money on your water bill or to avoid over-tapping your well/water source

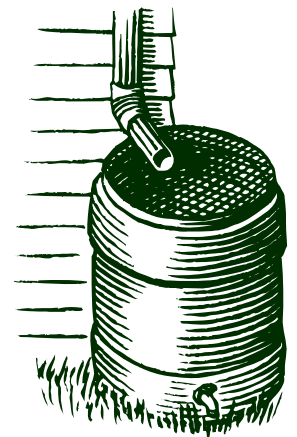
